CHARTER PUBLIC ORGANIZATION «FEDERATION CHESS COMPOSITION MINIATURE»



The public organization "Federation chess composition miniature" (hereinafter referred to as FCCM) is a voluntary Association of chess players engaged in the preparation and solution of miniature chess compositions, i.e. compositions with a total number of pieces on the Board of no more than seven.

FCCM created at the online meeting of the Presidential Council September 10, 2019. From this moment on, the Federation has a round seal and an emblem with its name.

1. Goals and objectives FCCM

1.1. The purpose of the FCCM is to promote chess compositions of miniatures among chess players, regardless of their place of residence, age and gender.

2. Activities FCCM

2.1. FCCM leads to the promotion of chess compositions of the thumbnails using the following media:

- site "7 chess notes", address: <u>http://7shahmat.ru/</u>

- magazine "Seven chess notes" (hereinafter - "SCN").

2.2. FCCM conducts the following competitions compilation of chess compositions miniatures:

- annual contest of the magazine "SCN»;

- miniature championship (personal) once every three years;

- "Album FCCM";

- solving tournaments for juniors (under 21).

2.3. FCCM publishes brochures for chess composition in the library "SSN".

2.4. FCCM teaches young composers ("SCN" - "ABC compositions").

2.5. FCCM sports establishes standards and conducts the calculation of the personal rating chess composers on the basis of performance in competitions FCCM.

In connection with the transition to the new method, the rating was recalculated in orthodox and unorthodox problem sections for the periods:

- miniaturists championship (personal) - 2008-2010;

- annual competition "SCN" since 2011;
- contests of affiliated organizations.

Also added rating results for the results - «Album of Russia. Miniatures» for 1992-2011.

The FCCM sets the following sports standards:

- «Grandmaster of miniature chess composition»;

- «Master of miniature chess composition»:

- «Candidate for master of miniature chess composition»;

- «1, 2, 3-digit chess composition of the miniature».

The assignment of titles and categories is carried out based on the results of the implementation of sports standards (Annex 1). When performing a sports standard, a chess player receives a corresponding qualification certificate by sending a personal request to the FCCM.

2.6. FCCM establishes qualification standards for arbitrators and sets up the following ranks:

- «Arbiter of the highest category of miniature chess composition»;

- «Arbiter of 1, 2, 3 categories of miniature chess composition".

The assignment of titles is carried out based on the results of compliance with the standards for arbitrators (Annex 2). When the standard is met, the chess player receives the appropriate qualification certificate by sending a personal request to the FCCM.

2.7. FSHCM establishes qualification standards for juniors in tournaments for solving chess compositions and sets the following standards: master (Junior), candidate for master (Junior), 1, 2, 3 categories (Junior). The assignment of titles and categories is carried out based on the results of the implementation of sports standards (Appendix 3).

2.8. FCCM addresses issues associated with the occurrence of various conflict situations in competitions under their auspices.

3. Guide FSCM

3.1. The user performs FCCM Presidential Council, the composition of which is chosen once in two years. All members of the Presidential Council have one voice when deciding organizational and other issues.

3.2. The Presidential Council decides on the activities of the FCCM, as well as changes to the Charter, by direct absentee voting by a majority of votes, and it is possible to vote only "For "or "Against".

3.3. All activities FCCM is carried out on a voluntary basis.

4. Actors FSCM, rights and responsibilities

4.1. Party activities FCCM is any player, who plays in competitions held FCCM.

4.2. The rights of participant activities FCCM:

- publish compositions in the media FCCM;

- receive the calculation of the personal rating at the end of the competition FCCM:

- comply with sports standards based on the results of competitions held by the FCCM, with the receipt of appropriate qualification certificates in electronic or printed format upon personal request;

- receive diplomas based on the results of competitions in electronic or printed format upon personal request.

4.3. Obligations of party activities FCCM:

- by sending their compositions to the FCCM competitions, the participant agrees to publish the following information about himself / herself in the mass media: first name, last name, region, country of residence, and sends his / her photo upon additional request;

- when receiving diplomas or other documents in printed format - to compensate the organizers for the cost of its production and postage.

Appendix 1

SPORTS STANDARDS OF CHESS COMPOSERS THE COMPETITION FCCM

1. The personal rating of a chess composer is calculated using the formula R = Rs + K,

R – personal rating of the chess composer;

Rs - starting rating of the chess composer, Rs = 1800 points;

K – the number of points awarded in the competition is shown in Table 1.

If there are equal places or if there are several authors in the composition, the number of points is divided equally between the participants.

Only those sections of the competition where at least 12 chess players participate are considered to be scoring points for calculating the rating.

2. Sports standards for awarding titles are shown in Table 2.

There are two ways to assign a title:

- simultaneous performance of the rating value and the minimum number of 1-3 places without dividing the third places with subsequent places;

- set the specified number of points in the Album FCCM.

* The "Miniaturists' Championship" column indicates the minimum number of 1-3 places without dividing the third places with subsequent places.

** 4 points are awarded for each composition in the "Miniature Chess Composition Federation Album" (see Table 1). If there are several authors of a composition, the number of points is divided equally between the participants. 3. Sports standards for assigning categories are shown in Table 3.

Appendix 2

QUALIFICATION STANDARDS FOR ARBITRATORS

The performance of the qualification standards for referees in any competitions for drawing up miniatures since 2008 is carried out in accordance with Table 4.

To assign the category of arbiter, the chess player provides the FCCM with supporting documents on judging the required number of competitions. Supporting documents are copies of the judges ' reports, which indicate: the name of the competition, the year of its holding, the judge.

Appendix 3

JUNIOR QUALIFICATION STANDARDS IN TOURNAMENTS ON THE DECISION OF CHESS COMPOSITIONS Fundamentals

1) Qualification standards are established in order to create moral and sporting incentives for juniors under 21 years of age on the day of the tournament. All tournaments on the solving of chess compositions held under the auspices of the "Federation of chess composition thumbnails" (FCCM) and have sports status only within FSCM.

Control in terms of compliance with the rules is given to the participant himself, because in this case it is important for him directly: to learn how to solve chess compositions, and not to use hints.

2) at least 10 Junior chess players must participate in each tournament in the overall standings. Face-to-face tournaments are held at the request of the regions on the same day according to the tasks prepared by the FCCM.

3) the Standards are set for two groups of participants: no older than 13 years and no older than 21 years on the day of the competition. Completed qualification standards of the Junior group do not apply to the senior group.

Performance of qualification standards for juniors in competitions for solving compositions-miniatures is carried out in accordance with Table 5.

4) Their results shown in FSHCM tournaments (for example, 1 tournament - 52%; 2 tournament-56% - 3rd category completed).
